### Be Satisfied

This third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is a Latin word that means "rejoice." This name is taken from the entrance antiphon of our Sunday's liturgy, which is also echoed in the second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians. "Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I will say Rejoice." Holy Family Catholic Community marks this special Sunday of Advent by lighting a third candle, this time pink instead of purple, on our Advent wreath. This third Sunday of Advent reminds us that our relationship with God defines who we are as Catholic Christians. We believe that our very "being," and every other human being, is blessed through God's loving presence. This is the message of St. John the Baptist as he prepares the way of the Lord, inviting us into a rich, authentic, honest, and selfless relationship with God that is also about service to others. The season of Advent challenge us in unique and personal ways to look at our own lives in the context of love and service. Let us use the words of St. John the Baptist to examine our lives:

Are the valleys of our own feelings of emptiness being filled, and are the mountains or obstacles in our lives being lowered?

Are we clearing out these obstacles to prepare for the Lord's return?

Are we engaging in actions that show we have turned away from selfishness and toward true service?

What and who is the source of our Advent hope? In today's gospel, St. John does not hesitate to call into question a human foundational belief and perspective that my personal property and possessions belong to me. St. John knows that the human heart is often unsatisfied with what it has is always wanting more. St. John puts things in a new perspective. Everything we have does not belong to us, is not our own, but belongs first and foremost to God. St. John reminds us that God has abundantly blessed us and now calls us to share our blessings more freely with one another. A life turned towards God understands and lives this truth. The repentant heart learns to understand ownership from this new perspective, and that doing good for others takes precedence over our own creature comforts. That is a hard message to absorb. One of the first fruits of genuine repentance St. John is seeking is a life turned toward God and sharing all that we have, not begrudgingly, but joyfully. Repenting is primarily about changing our hearts and perspectives, removing any selfish obstacles, and turning more freely to God.

St. John tells the crowd that whoever has two shirts must share with the one who has none and to

do the same with their food. He preaches that our relationship with God is not about social separation or about the right way, or even the best way, to worship and pray to God. St. John believes that an authentic relationship with God is uniquely about how we look out for the stranger and care for the needs of one another. Jesus builds on this very same message. The idea that St. John teaches involves a uniquely unselfish approach to life and a more compassionate inclusivity of one another. In very practical ways, we are invited to be detached from our possessions, make sure that the basic needs of others are met, and turn toward God in unselfish ways.

When God becomes the most important part of our identity, we put joy back into our hearts and in the lives of our family, friends, community, nation, and world. God genuinely and uniquely loves us, is patient with us, and invites us to reciprocate His love for one another. Through this relationship with God, we believe that every person is made in God's beautiful image. Since everyone is invited to connect with God, we need to find significant ways to connect with one another. Our appreciation for the life of others and their well-being encourages us to create relationships that are significant, selfless and sacrificial. When we realize that we are all God's children, we see a renewed hope in our relationships with one another. This mid-point of Advent alerts us to the important issues of social justice and equality among all God's people.

As the faith community of Holy Family, we are called to value one another for who we are and not for what we can do for one another. When this becomes our way of thinking, our daily interactions will give us reasons to rejoice. As we value others more, it changes us, deepens our connections with others, and love grows exponentially. When we know that the people in our lives are meant to be **loved**, **served** and valued, we begin to see how God **loves**, **serves** and values us every day of our lives.

This weekend, let us be attentive to St. John the Baptist's words of faith with the tax collectors, soldiers, and crowds to not overcharge, to share from their surplus with the needy, and to not exploit anyone. May we be reminded of our own and every other person's dignity and self-worth. St. John reminds us that Jesus comes into the world to live and love according to the truths of everyone's human dignity and equality. May every person know that they are precious, uniquely made, and are all a valuable part of God's creation. God invites us to know Him because He already knows us and loves us deeply and intimately.

- Fall Fest/Hops on the Vine exceeded fund raising goals

- Electric costs were 15-20% per kWh higher than last year
- Overage in Arch Assessments partially offset by lower insurance

Parish budgeted for loss in Q1 based on income lower in summer and planned repairs to the facility when building is least occupied.

Holy Family experiences seasonal spikes in income associated with Christmas, Easter and the timing of FAITH Tuition payments, where expenses are more consistent and have less seasonality. We have taken a more conscious approach to these seasonal fluctuations during our FY19 budgeting.



# HFCA Students *Alert* to an issue and *Fill a Need*

Our Advent theme calls us to *be alert* and *be filled*. HFCA's second grade students have become alerted to the needs of others and have responded by being filled with compassion to help those in need.

Recently, during an economics unit (yes, in 2nd grade!) our second grade teachers, Mrs. Catherine Lyon and Mrs. Susan Marinelli saw their students learn about an important issue and seek to make a difference.

The economics lesson was designed to integrate math, reading, technology, geography, and faith into a single project. Teachers began with a discussion of needs versus wants and expanded that to explain goods and services and scarcity of resources.

The students, who recently lost a classmate to cancer, decided to earn money to donate to Lemons of Love, a non-profit, 501(c)(3) organization that creates, fills, and delivers chemo care packages that contain items to help address the day-to-day challenges of chemotherapy patients.

Students met with their parents and determined ways to earn money to donate. The money began to come in as children earned a quarter for making their bed or fifty cents for taking out the garbage. In total, the HFCA students earned \$914.61!

Mrs. Lyon and Mrs. Marinelli have been involved in charity drives at other schools, but they contend that none have elicited the same level of student excitement and ownership as this unit. Concludes Mrs. Lyon, "HFCA's approach to teaching and learning is unique. Teachers engage student-driven inquiries, guide students in seamless learning involving many subject areas, and most importantly encourage students to live their faith to make the world a better place."



### Lenten Social Justice Project Recaps \$371,266 has been raised over the past 5 Years

We will embark on another Lenten Social Justice Project in 2019. Later next month, there will be more information about our next project. What Holy Family has achieved in terms financial donations and overall awareness of a particular issue has been monumental. Below is a recap of our past 5 projects.

2018 – Peaceful Pathways, Chicago, IL – We joined Cardinal Cupich's Violence Prevention initiative targeting vulnerable, at risk youth in Chicago's most troubled neighborhoods. Although "Anti-Violence" describes our intent, "Peaceful Pathways" describes our approach. Our contributions of \$103,134 supported two highly successful local programs: Strong Futures on the south side of Chicago and The Peace Corner Youth Center on the west side.

2017 - San Miguel Arcangel Church, San Miguel de los Banos, Cuba – This Lenten project worked in collaboration with Catholic Extension and was our most successful in terms of donations raising \$95,000. This enabled Catholic Extension to provide grant money to not only rehab San Miguel Arcangel Church, but also two chapels in the Diocese of Pinar del Rio - Las Ovas Chapel and Paso Real de San Diego Chapel. St. Rosendo Cathedral also received grant funding to complete their renovations. To date, all projects are moving along quite well as the both chapels are very close to completion and St. Rosendo Cathedral is moving ahead of schedule. San Miguel Arcangel is also moving along well as they continue to gather the materials needed for completion. The bell tower has been removed as they begin its rebuild. Thankfully, all four structures received little damage from Hurricane Irma.

2016 – JOURNEYS|THE ROAD HOME – Holy Family Parish is a PADS site, which hosts the local homeless clients registered through JOURNEYS on Sunday evenings, Oct through April. Raising \$54,384 directly assisted JOURNEYS in their care and guidance of those who are homeless and those on the verge of homelessness. Critical services such as long-term case management, job counseling, minor medical care, men-

tal health screenings, and most of all, securing permanent and stable housing are provided. A year following our Social Justice Project, they were able to secure housing for 135 clients, which is their greatest success rate to date.

2015 - St. Anne's Mission Church, Red Lake Reservation, Red Lake, MN - St. Mary's Mission Church and School, with a staff of 20 people, help to care for and educate the Native American residents of Red Lake. The pastor, Fr. Jerry Rogers, feels that by surrounding the children and their families with the power of prayer, the living witness of Catholic beliefs and a strong education, the greater hope there will be for their future. Holy Family raised \$70,030 to support a Staff Associate and to sustain the education of the children attending the school, again, in collaboration with Catholic Extension. Our gift assisted the school, which is experiencing increased enrollment, and a salary for an Outreach Director and Parish Nurse. On a sad note, the church experienced a fire and the building was totaled. Fr. Jerry Rogers is, as always, optimistic, and he expressed hope that the church will rebuild. He said, "Out of the ashes will rise a new church."

#### 2014 - St. Paul Mission Church in McKee, KY

– St. Paul is a small mission church in Appalachia (the only Catholic Church in that county) and serves a rural population. It cannot sustain the salary of a full-time priest. Rebecca Koury (now Rebecca Woods) is the Pastoral Associate. Holy Family raised \$48,718 to pay Rebecca's salary and support the many ministries she administers in collaboration with Catholic Extension. Since 2014, Rebecca has instituted many programs benefitting youth, adults and the greater community. You will hear more about their granola project as the details firm up.

### HOLY LAND TRIP March 30-April 12, 2019

Fr. Rich Jakubik and Fr. Ed Harnett (St. Francis Xavier Parish in Wilmette) invite you on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Our pilgrimage begins in Galilee and the many places connected to Jesus. We would stay at one hotel, the Gai Beach on the Sea of Galilee for our time in Galilee. The next week we would go to Jerusalem and settle again into one hotel, Notre Dame de Jerusalem, for the week, across the street from the New Gate of the old walled city. 
