#### Finding our way back home and into the heart of God

This year's Lenten theme at Holy Family invites us to take a journey into our hearts; *The Return:* a radical journey of the heart. From the placement of the pallets in the sanctuary; to the sign post pointing in the three distinct directions of dignity, goodness, and humanity; to the photographs and posters in the back of church with social justice teachings, all of which invite us to be a little more introspective, self-reflective and active in choosing our course in life. Is the direction we are going taking us back home and into the heart of God?

On this third Sunday of Lent, we hear about Moses' curiosity that makes him want to "get up and go look." Moses encounters a divine presence in the form of a burning bush. This divine presence is calling him, seeking him, loving him and guiding him home and into the heart of God. Moses' experience of God reflects back to him the direction he is going. Is the direction he is going offering him hope, filling him with compassion for the world; opening his eyes to a new way of being, a new way of seeing, a new way of living; deepening his relationships; revealing love; and growing him more and more into God's likeness? If not, he must look again.

After this encounter with God, Moses becomes more honest with himself and able to acknowledge that he has spent too much time making a home in places that were far too temporary, fleeting and passing. Like Moses, the direction of where we are going will determine how we live, how we navigate life, and how we relate to God and our neighbor. We answer the question of where we are going by our choices, decisions, priorities and the relationships we create. Even if we never directly ask ourselves the question of where we are going, we are always answering it. We answer it every minute of every day. Ultimately this question lies at the core of our relationship with God.

In the ancient world, mountaintops were the traditional dwelling places for the divine. There, at the mountain, Moses encountered an unquenchable burning bush that, like a sacramental window, revealed and hid, was dangerous and attractive, frightening and comforting, untamed and reassuring. When Moses was instructed to remove his sandals, God was identifying not only that he was standing on holy ground, but also that Moses had never fully been "home" in any community up until now. He had belonged nowhere. By taking off his

sandals, this gesture was associated not only with a worship space, but also of finding his way back home to God. Here, at the foot of the mountain, Moses the "alien," the "foreigner," the "refugee," now found a true "home." His true home was with God, the God of his ancestors, "the God of Abraham...of Isaac...of Jacob." The real issue for Moses had been his belonging. He had lost track of how to be in a relationship with God. Moses now learned that no matter who he was, what he had done, what had been done to him, he was a child of God. Even away from home, he belonged to a Father who wanted to help him out of his lost-ness.

These truths about the God of second chances is also reflected in the Gospel of Luke. The story of the fig tree is about the patience of God, the need for more time to grow in our faith and prayer and our relationship with the 'God of many chances.' The parable of the fig tree offers a glimpse of hope. The gardener will do what he can to produce fruit from the fig tree, giving it more time and attention. The gardener is confident that if he makes another effort, the fig tree will bear fruit, in spite of appearances. The owner sees only that the barren fig tree is wasting valuable space. But the gardener, who is more an expert in these matters, loves the tree and sees that it may have potential with proper care and nurturing. He wants to give it another chance. The gardener represents God's compassion for us and activity in our life to make us blossom. Like the fig tree, God is giving us more time to bear fruit. What do we need to become fruitful trees that give of themselves generously to others? Let us turn away from anything that is not of God and ask for help in entering more deeply into the world of goodness and love, of light and of truth.

"Most Holy God, in your holy word we read so many stories about the ones you have protected as they left home in search of a better way of life. Scripture inspires us to strive for greater hospitality to the poor, the weak and strangers. We pray for all dreamers. We pray that they will be allowed to find work, study and live in safety. We pray that those in authority may turn away from prejudice, fear and scarcity, and that they will set their hearts on acts of mercy. We pray that you will give us vision and inspire us in our actions as we seek to realize our goal of liberty and justice for all. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen."

## **2019 Lenten Social Justice Project**

## Kino Border Initiative and Holy Family Fund

Humanize the immigration issue; recognize its complexity; accompany people on their journey.

This Lenten season, Holy Family will walk a path alongside individuals and families striving to live a life that is productive, strengthens the family unit, and maintains inherent dignity - all within an environment that is safe and nurturing. Our intent is to humanize the immigration issue and to recognize its complexity, while emphasizing accompaniment of people on their journey.

Respecting the human dignity of every individual is the first and foremost Catholic social teaching. Another teaching holds that people have a right to migrate to sustain their lives and the lives of their families. It also says governments have a right to regulate their borders, and must do so with justice and mercy.

Last week we learned about the Kino Border Initiative (KBI). This week, let's look at another component of KBI and the Holy Family Fund. KBI's Research and Advocacy provides a space in which scholars and students can do research on migration to help find solutions to complex realities at the border. The Holy Family Fund (named for Holy Family Parish in honor of our commitment to the mission work of Catholic Extension) offers assistance to immigrants faced with a crisis due to family separation.

**KBI Research and Advocacy** - The Kino Border Initiative (KBI), the Center for Migration Studies of New York, the Office of Justice and Ecology of the Jesuit Conference of Canada and the US initiated a study to examine the characteristics of deportees and the effects of deportation, and to place them in a broader policy context. During the first five months of 2018, KBI staff surveyed 133 deportees from the US. A few facts from their survey:

- immigrants have lived in the US, on average, for 19.9 years
- 56% entered as minors (below age 18) and 21% below age 10
- 38% reported having had legal status in the US, 14.3% were lawful permanent residents\*
- · 26% had been US homeowners
- · 52% participated in church activities
- 87% had US citizen children
- · 42% had US citizen spouses or partners
- · 96% had been employed in the US
- On average, they worked nearly 10 years in the same job
- Most respondents reported their spouse or partner in the US did not have enough money to support their children or to live on.
  - 45% identified only a little or not at all with their country of birth.

\*Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act (IIRIRA) of 1996 triggered increase deportations of long-term residents, including lawful permanent residents for committing relatively minor crimes often in the distant past.

One family in particular tells a story about an abrupt separation when a father was put into immigration detention. His wife was four months pregnant with their 6th child when he was taken from his home in the presence of his children. The wife's pregnancy was high-risk and with the primary bread winner gone, doctors urged her to consider terminating the pregnancy. She never considered that option and brought the baby to full term. He was named Emanuel believing that God was with the family in spite of their pain.

The oldest girls, both in AP classes in high school, now have to work to help support the family and find it difficult to study properly. They all miss their father and husband desperately and continue to suffer from the trauma of separation and the uncertainty of the future.

The **Holy Family Fund** will help families like the one described above. It is a program provided by Catholic (Continued on next page)

Extension in partnership with the local Catholic Charities offices. It provides emergency funds and services to a family after one or more of the undocumented income earning adults in the home are detained or deported by the US government. The families contribute to the fund on a monthly basis (\$20 for an individual, \$30 for a couple). The participant becomes eligible by enrolling through an agency such as Catholic Charities and paying their monthly fee to the Holy Family Fund. After the needs of the family are assessed, the family may receive benefits up to \$5000 per enrolled participant to help pay for rent or house payments, utilities, health care, etc. to maintain stability for the family. (Brochures will be available soon).

Our goal is to raise a total of \$25,000 for the two programs – the **Holy Family Fund** and the **Kino Border Initiative**. Both programs are supported by Catholic Extension Society. We look forward to walking this Lenten journey with you.

# What does our faith ask of us over Lent?

Basically, our faith asks us to engage in Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving.

**Prayer** - Lent is essentially an act of prayer spread out over 40 days. As we pray, we go on a journey, one that hopefully brings us closer to Christ and leaves us changed by the encounter with him.

**Fasting** – Fasting is more than giving up a certain food or drink. It is an opportunity to provide an emptiness which allows more space for God to enter our lives and transform us

**Alms-giving** - Through prayer and fasting, we grow in solidarity with others living in despair or without basic, adequate resources and turn our attention away from ourselves and to the suffering of our brothers and sisters, no matter where they live.

This Lent, Holy Family asks you to spend time with our Lenten Social Justice Project as a way to engage in prayer, fasting and alms-giving. We pray this experience brings you to a closer relationship with God and with all God's children living in solidarity on this tiny planet called Earth.




