# Fr. Terry Keehan

## Mother's Day

Happy Mother's Day to all of the women in our lives who bring, perpetuate and give life. Our second reading this weekend from the fourth chapter of the First Letter of John underscores the importance of connecting life with love. God is the source of all life and we are invited, through faith, to seamlessly connect life with love. Too many moms to count do that on a regular basis.

I visited the first grade class at our Academy last week to prepare for Mass of which this same reading generated the theme that the students selected, "Let Us Love One Another."

I shared with the students that the most important thing is not that we love God, but that God loves us. One girl raised her hand and said, "You mean loving God isn't the most important thing?"

During my homily for the Mass that they had planned I admitted that I didn't answer her in the best way. I asked them if they had ever said anything that they knew they could have said better. They all admitted they had by nodding their heads.

I want to share with you what I told them, and a better way to convey the message of this reading. I said that the First Commandment urges us to love God with our whole heart and soul and mind, and then to love one another, not as two commandments, but as one. I then said there is only one thing more important than that – to believe, know, feel and share that God loves us and that God loved us first.

Let's be grateful for all the mothers in our lives who loved us first, even before we knew how to love, and they recognized that God loved them first, and believing that enabled them to love us.

## AT THE TABLE:

### PREPARATION OF THE GIFTS

Deacon Dennis Brown offers an answer to this week's *At the Table* series question:

***What is significant about bringing up the gifts for the Mass?***

As we learned last week from Fr. Terry, the Prayers of the Faithful mark the end of the Liturgy of the Word. This week I will focus on the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the Preparation of the Gifts. During this time we are preparing the altar, the gifts, and ourselves to give thanks and praise to God in the eucharistic sacrificial meal.

The monetary gifts of the assembly are collected and brought forward along with the bread and wine (in non-coronavirus times). The bread and wine are placed on the altar, our table of thanksgiving. They will become the body and blood of the Lord. Our monetary gifts are presented as a symbol that our whole lives belong to God and that we will use whatever wealth we have in the service of God's Kingdom. This is a time for all of us to join ourselves with Christ so that we can offer eternal sacrificial thanks and praise to God through him, with him, and in him.

The procession with the gifts of bread and wine is a significant expression of the assembly's commitment to love and serve as Jesus did. It is our tradition here at Holy Family to stand when the gifts of bread and wine are brought forward to the altar. In this manner, we are powerfully affirming that those who present the gifts symbolize the entire assembly's commitment and faith. We are offering all that we have and all that we are, our successes and failures, our joys and sufferings, our daily prayer and work, to be joined with Jesus' one eternal sacrifice of love. We are expressing our commitment to die to self and live a life of sacrificial love as he did. And, in so doing, we will all be transformed in Christ.

### Tips from Fr. Terry for Meditation (Rivers of Silence) from our April 21st session

1. Find a quiet place
2. Find an appropriate chair – a straight back chair is best. Comfy chairs might make you fall asleep and that is NOT the goal of meditation.
3. Always start the prayer process with God. Ask God to be with you in a special way. Acknowledge God's presence and your partnership with God. Begin with, "God, come to my assistance, Lord, make haste to help me." (Words from the Liturgy of the Hours)
4. Sit up straight and let the chair support you.
5. Take several deep breaths. Inhale through your nose by pushing your stomach OUT. Pull your stomach IN as you exhale.
6. Select a passage of Scripture (the upcoming weekend's Gospel reading is always a good place to start).
7. Read the passage slowly and let it speak to you. Read it again, if needed.
8. Close your eyes. Don't move. Stay very still.
9. Repeat the word or phrase that "speaks to you" over and over, silently and slowly. Turn it into a mantra. Let it sink in...

Carloads of goods and supplies were delivered to the Palatine home from the bins that collected the items outside the church doors as well as direct drop offs and Amazon deliveries. Diana at St. Joe's noted that there was a big increase in donations over those three weeks of our Lenten Project.

We also collected a total of **\$51,204** in cash donations not to mention gift cards, Costco rebates and Easter Holiday Sharing gift cards for each resident bringing that total to almost \$54,000!!
