I believe that we celebrate who we are as a vibrant community of faith every week in so many ways here at Holy Family. The celebration includes, but is not limited to, Mass. We proclaim, "The Mass never ends," and although not perfectly, but certainly intentionally, we show our vibrant spirit in many ways. This weekend and next we will celebrate who we are here at Holy Family and mark a significant aspect of our history.

We resume our FM Mass this Sunday at 9:00am. This particularly vibrant and inclusive Mass has brought great energy, enthusiasm and participation for several generations. These unique Masses will be offered once a month throughout the year.

This weekend after all Masses we will be hosting special Welcome Gatherings in the rectory. They are opportunities to meet other new parishioners and to register as a parishioner if you have not done so yet. Covid caused us to cancel any such gatherings, and we are excited to resume and expand them because almost 300 new families have registered in the past year and a half.

Next Sunday, September 25, we celebrate Fall Fest. This has been a relatively recent tradition and we have had several variations of this event. This year's version includes music, inflatables, Kona Ice, train and wagon rides, a petting zoo, crafts, games and lots of fall photo ops. The event will begin with a Knights of Columbus pancake breakfast from 8:30am-12:30pm. We encourage you to attend either 9:00am or 11:00am Mass and the festivities will conclude at 3:00pm. Raffle tickets will be available following the 9am and 11am Masses this weekend. Please see more details on our website.

The above are three relatively new additions to our community. One that has been with us for 25 years is our beautiful Cross of New Life. Next weekend we mark the anniversary of installation of the Cross.

Fr. Med Laz and a group of very dedicated founding parishioners worked very hard on making the Cross a reality. Our church was constructed in 1988 without a large cross or crucifix. Fr. Laz had a vision in the spirit of a great Chicagoan Daniel Burnham who espoused, "Make no small plans." I think we all would agree that the Cross is anything but small. Fr. Laz wanted not only a cross but a statement, and no small statement. The Cross of New Life is very large in size (the largest piece of acrylic art in the world), but it is even bigger in impact and symbolism. It has

become the cornerstone for the opening of our mission statement, "Inviting all to new life in Christ..."

The artist that Fr. Laz selected to make his big statement a reality is Ernest Caballero (see the history of the Cross on our website or in the handout available at the front desk). I had the privilege of visiting with him and his wife in 2012 when I was doing a Mission at a parish near where he lives in Northern California. A model of the cross is the center piece of Ernest's studio, so he is obviously very proud of it.

In September of 1997 the Cross was carefully transported here. The tree on the East side of the church was pulled to the side and the large windows near it were removed so the Cross could be brought into and hung above our sanctuary where it continually gives an invitation for new life from Jesus Christ.

There are so many feelings that the Cross elicits in me. For example, the outstretched hand of Christ is a symbol of our welcoming spirit. As one young parishioner said upon looking at the Cross, "Look Grandma, Jesus wants to hold my hand."

Countless people have relayed to me and others that they feel welcome here at Holy Family and the Cross of New Life is a concrete sign that we extend Christ's welcome to all.

Often when I look at our Cross I see Christ extending a hand above our altar as if to say, "Look what beautiful things take place here in my name."

We have altered our brand a bit recently with an image of the Cross from the side. I believe that this has given a fresh perspective on the new life that Christ is inviting us to. When we look at the Cross straight on we can be invited to see Jesus literally coming off of the Cross. I often say that it infers that his other hand is still nailed to the cross, so he is coming out of his suffering to give us new life. That is a simple and yet very powerful example of the Paschal Mystery—through suffering and death comes new life.

As we look at the Cross from the side the extended hand can be viewed as reaching out to others as well as to us personally. The side view even invites us to reach out with Christ to others offering new life.

I know that the Cross has a particularly powerful invitation to those who gather beneath it during the funeral of a loved one. At those moments people feel consoled with the invitation to take Christ's hand as they commend their loved one into new and eternal life.

What does the Cross of New Life say to you?



Adventures in Grace: a pilgrimage *Revisited* Adventure Two: Baptism (Drenched!)

The Adult Faith Community... supports the mission of lifelong learning by providing educational, spiritual, and formation activities for the parish and the community.

As we continue to remind ourselves of the key take-aways from each of the Wednesday evening adventures with Dr. Terry Nelson-Johnson, this week we revisit the Sacrament of **Baptism**.

1. Baptism, like all sacraments, is contemporary – dynamic and a verb – suggesting that we are subject to encountering Baptism – to being **DRENCHED** in the mysterious Love of God at any juncture – today – this minute. Baptism is NOT limited to a one-time, long ago event. On any given day, we are more, OR less, baptized. Thus, we must continually renew our baptismal identities. We do this liturgically a number of times over the course of the year, but most of us do not take this seriously and/or are oblivious to our responsibility, our privilege, to actively and intentionally renew our lived experience and **FELT** sense of ourselves as Baptized, as the Beloved of God.

Based on this understanding of Baptism, Dr. Terry Nelson-Johnson recommended the following spiritual exercises:

- Who am I? (I am baptized!)
- Who has helped minister Baptism to me?
- What keeps me from knowing myself as baptized?
- TODAY, what can I do to renew my baptismal identity?
- TODAY, where did I notice “Little Moments of Baptism”?

2. One of the primary, if not THE PRIMARY, fruit of Baptism is FREEDOM. What does this statement mean to you?

3. Read Romans 6:3-4. Coming to know ourselves as baptized will involve some surrender. It will involve dying to all the parts of ourselves that we deem unworthy of such Love. What does this mean to you? Is it worth the risk?

4. There's a reason that Baptism is the Portal (First) sacrament; it's a cooperative venture. God cannot “do” Baptism to us. If Baptism “works,” then we are open to receiving and cooperating with all the Grace that God aches to lavish on us. If Baptism does not “work,” if we don't KNOW ourselves as baptized, then we can go through all the rituals we want and still be a captive. Baptism, like all Sacraments and Grace, is not earned and is not a magic trick; it's a GIFT that must be received and responded to every day. Read Galatians 3:26-28.

5. Fr. Richard Rohr suggests that the core characteristic of Love is Flow. If God is Love, then the Trinity is an endless Flow of Love that literally drives the universe. When we experience God as Trinity, we see a relationship between Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, a Relationship of Love. That relationship is then shared between the Creator and creation, and is bound together in Love. We are baptized into this relational flow calling us to be in relationship with each other. We are called into community.

6. Religious ritual is supposed to be emotional and take our breath away. Being Church is supposed to change us. How is this your experience?

Embracing Pope Francis' Call for "Decent and Dignified Working Conditions" for All

As the pandemic eases a bit, we breathe a collective sigh of cautious relief. We mourn the loss of loved ones and co-workers. At the same time, we give thanks for "having made it through!" We learned a lot about ourselves, our public health safeguards, and our interconnectedness with "essential workers". In addition to the tireless first responders on the front lines, we deepened our awareness of our dependence on food production workers, drivers, workers who provide in-home care, etc. As we pulled back the curtain on our economic systems during the pandemic, we realized that the workers who kept us safe and comfortable were the lowest-paid and the most poorly treated workers, most often immigrant and African-American workers.

In a recent speech on the topic of economic disparity, Pope Francis addressed Domestic Workers, those who care for our family members and our homes, stating, "It must be ensured that social assistance reaches the hidden economy and pays special attention to the particular needs of "women and girls". Founded by faith leaders in 1991 on the mission to lift up workers' lives, Arise Chicago is heeding the call of Pope Francis. Arise advocated successfully to eliminate the subminimum wage for Domestic Workers and now works to ensure that their employers abide by the new Chicago law by providing written contracts in their native language. arisechicago.org/domestic_workers.

Pope Francis further stated that, as we address the harsh economic realities laid bare by the pandemic, we must rebuild economies that create a future with, "decent and dignified working conditions, originating in collective bargaining." His words echo over 100 years of Catholic Social Teaching, stating that collective bargaining rights are essential to create a just economy. Arise Chicago, along with the Chicago Federation of Labor, is supporting a "yes" vote for the Workers' Rights Amendment, which will be on our ballots in November. By amending the Illinois constitution so that collective bargaining rights for future generations are guaranteed, the Workers' Rights Amendment upholds Catholic Social Teaching and the Pope's recent directions.

As communities of faith, we are called to heed the Pope's call to stand in solidarity with all workers. Sisters and brothers in the faith, there is a sacred link between our faith, our work, and the workers who make our lives possible. With the grace of God, may those links be strengthened that those who steward our businesses may more and more recognize their sacred responsibility to respect the dignity and sanctity of workers, providing wages, benefits and a work environment that honors them and their families! Happy Labor Day!
